Phone ringtones download app

The smartphone app stores are well established at this point, and as much as we like to see new apps available, it also means: sometimes apps go away. Here's what you can do if your favorites disappear. Why do apps disappear? Before we talk about how you can get apps that are no longer available to download from your phone's respective app store, let's first talk about why apps are removed in the first place. Normally, this is a call by the developer; The app is pulled because they no longer support it. Case in point: Epic Games recently pulled all versions of the Infinity Blade from the iOS App Store for that exact reason. The company claims a lack of resources to support the game at a level that meets [their] current standards. Understandable — if you're going to do something, as well it might be right, after all. More often than not, this is how it goes. App support gets more trouble than it's worth continuing, its features are transferred from the same developer (and no need for redundancy) to another app, or the developer is completely dissolved. The good news is that if the app you're looking for isn't available for any of those reasons, you should still be able to download it again if you've downloaded it before (this is especially true for paid apps). That said, it's worth noting that if the app has been removed by the App Store company itself—in Google's case for the Apple iOS App Store or play store — then it's gone forever. If they've pulled it off, there's a good reason for it so you can't expect to get it back easily. If the app is no longer in the App Store, this is the easiest way to get it back for both Android or iOS devices. How to download apps are no longer in the iOS App Store If you are an iOS user, your options are quite limited - you have to get your apps from the App Store. Luckily, if you bought or downloaded an app that's no longer available, you can probably still catch it. First, fire the App Store, then tap the account icon in the top right corner. From there, tap Purchased. To see all the apps that aren't already on your phone or iPad (which is the possible scenario if you're trying to pull something that's no longer in the App Store), tap No on this iPhone/iPad. From there, you can scroll through the list to find the app you want to install, then tap on the small cloud icon to the right to download it. Easy easily. How to download apps that are no longer in Google Play While you have the same option to download deprecated apps on iOS, there are a few ways to do this on Android: Get it from google play store or download APK and sideload the app. While the former is the most direct way out, the latter offers a way to install completely deleted apps from Google Play. Removed from Google Play How to install apps first, open play store, then open menu by tapping three lines in top left (inside (inside Search box). From there, choose my apps and games. Once this menu opens, choose Library. It will list every app you've ever downloaded from Google Play. Unfortunately, there's not an easy way to find this list, so if you're looking for an old app, it can take a long time to find it by scrolling. The good news is that you have another option: sideload the APK. How sideload apps that are no longer in Google Play sorting through the crazy list of apps can be a huge pain, so in that case, it can be easier to sideload the app. If you've never sideloaded the app, before you've probably wanted to take a look at our full tutorial. It's not a complicated process, but how you do it will depend on which version your phone is running. Related: How to sideload apps on Android If you have previously sideloaded apps and need a good place to find something that's no longer in the Play Store, APK Mirror is your answer. This is the best place on the net to sideload Android apps. It's a trustworthy source that only features free apps (there are no pirated apps on APK Mirror), and every app is legitimate. It's also worth mentioning that there are many versions of some apps based on your phone's model and hardware details. If you're not sure which APK you should install, check out this primer. So, for example, if we say you want to install Sick (now the idle Evernote app). You simply catch the APK from apk mirror and install it on your device using the instructions above. Nothing to do it! RELATED: How to find your Android device information for the right APK download Quickly accessing downloaded files on your smartphone is important if you want to get the most of your device. Whether you downloaded text messages, email attachments or pictures or videos sent in files while browsing the web, they are all stored somewhere on your phone. If you're an Android user, locating your downloads is similar to using Windows Explorer or Mac's Finder, where folders can be sorted and edited in plain view. If you're an iPhone user running iOS 11 or 12, Apple's Files app connects you to storage locations of all your devices, both local and in the cloud. The instructions in this article apply to Android Nougat, Oreo and Pai as well as iOS 11 and 12. Getty Images/d3sign To navigate Android's internal storage, you just need a file manager app like My Files or ES File Explorer. Connecting your phone to the computer will also enable you to manage all the files and folders on your phone. In most cases, the things you download will end up in the Downloads folder. However, depending on the app, the location may be different. Open your favorite file manager, tap on internal storage (device name), then tap Pictures. Tap message. All your downloaded images, video and voice clip messages folder will be there. Go to the downloaded photo or video pictures folder with the Instagram and Facebook Messenger app. Open, open the My Files app, Tap on the internal storage. Tap download. All attachments downloaded through Samsung messages will be in the download directory. Open your file manager, tap on internal storage, then whats up. Tap Media. Your files and attachments are stored in your respective folders within WhatsApp's media directory. Videos and pictures downloaded with apps like Hangouts and Textra will be located in their respective folders on your device's internal storage. Tap and hold the link or file until more options appear, then tap the download link. Open your file manager and go to your internal storage, then tap Download. All files and attachments downloaded when using Chrome will end up in the download folder. Open your email with attachment, then tap on the download icon next to the drive icon. Open your file manager, go to internal storage, then tap Download. All attachments downloaded from Gmail will be in your download folder. Apps like Outlook and Samsung Email also store your attachments in the download folder. iPhone users running iOS 11 or 12 have more control where files are stored when downloaded. In the past, the download ended up in a location depending on the file type. However, in iOS 11 and above, you now have additional options when saving files to your iPhone. iOS 12 automatically saves images and videos sent and received via iMessage in photos. Open Safari on your desired website. Tap the download icon in the center of the bottom of the screen. Tap on my iPhone. Select the folder you want to save your file. Apple's Files app is a more streamlined approach to accessing pictures, videos and documents saved to your phone applications and cloud services. It's essentially the iPhone's file manager, and requires iOS 11 and up. Open the Files app. Tap an option under Locations to locate your iPhone's download.
